

# What are we doing and why are we doing it?

#### X Swifts

**Swift** numbers are in decline, partly because they nest inside eaves of buildings. As more buildings are renovated and eaves closed up or new developments are built without them entirely, swift nests are fast disappearing. We are helping to **bring back nesting opportunities**.

# Hedgehogs

**Hedgehogs** are in decline, mainly due to habitat loss. They need space to roam 2km a night to search for food and mates. In towns like Stockport, we are encouraging **wildlife-friendly gardening** and helping people put **holes in fences** so they can move freely.

# W Butterflies, moths, bees and wasps

Over 40% of insect species are declining. **Butterflies**, **moths**, **bees and wasps** are some of those most at risk. The main reason for their decline is habitat loss. We are helping to create **pollinator patches** to increase their habitat and allow them to move across our town.

# Wasted spaces

There are lots of **wasted spaces** in Stockport, abandoned patches of land, litter strewn verges or bin lined alleyways. These spaces are just waiting to become special places. We support communities in taking ownership and care of these spaces.

# Schools

Schools are a great place for children to learn how to care for wildlife and get involved in bringing nature back to Stockport. By installing nest boxes, hedgehog holes, and improving their grounds, schools can become champions for hedgehogs, swifts and pollinators.

## **Businesses**

Businesses have huge potential to add to their local community by acting more sustainably in their work, and perhaps greening up their shopfront or local space. We want to work with businesses to help them achieve these goals and become more wildlife friendly
